Church Leadership

Upon completion, he will be released from all German school requirements, and can resume his U.S. high-school education. He is currently a goalie in a local men's soccer program, and also plays on the youth Basketball league. In the church, you'll find Micah at the Media table, or assists in his teaching rotation with the kindergarten kids.

Kaylee is 12 years old going on 16. She just started the 7th grade. She recently opted out of basketball this year, and has started training to be a life-guard. She loves music, drawing, baking, and really, really loves her dog, Emma. In the church, Kaylee is busy with the kiddos. They flock to her as soon as they walk in the building. She also helps in the children's class rotation. She is praying about starting a prayer meeting at her school along with another young lady from the church.

Tobi is 9 years old. He is now in the 4th grade. This is the school year that decides which direction his grade-school education will take. Depending on his grades, he will be placed in one of three different schools. We try to avoid giving in to the pressure that the 4th grade carries with it. It seems so unreasonable for such young kids. Please pray for our little guy to stay encouraged throughout the school year. In addition to school, Tobi is busy playing with his neighborhood friends a playing for his youth soccer team. Currently, he and Mom are working through a discipleship program called, "Foundation Worldview".
